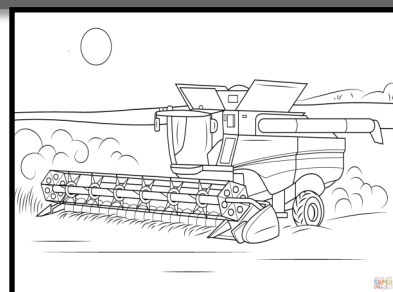

Angels of the Lord

In the past few days, the church celebrated two feasts of the Holy Angels. On Saturday the feast of the Holy Archangels and on Tuesday the memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels. Much can be said about the Holy Angels, there is also much we don't know. I would like to point out some basics about the angels and then at the end provide some further resources about them.

Let's first examine what the angels are not. Angels are not humans who have died and gone to heaven. Angels and humans are two entirely different kinds of beings. Angels are purely spiritual beings. Another way this is described in Philosophy is to say that angels are immaterial beings. This is part of the reason they can act so intimately with us. Because they are spiritual and created by God this way, they can interact with us directly on an interior level. Another fact about angels is that they do not 'earn their wings.' When angels were created by God, they were created precisely as they were meant to be. They remain this way for eternity. They do not have matter (bodies, hair, organs, etc.) so they do not change as we do (growing up, growing old, getting sick).

Who/what are the angels? The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic church states “The angels are purely spiritual creatures, incorporeal, invisible immortal, and personal beings endowed with intelligence and will. They ceaselessly contemplate God face-to-face, and they glorify him. They serve him and are his messengers in the accomplishment of his saving mission to all.” (#60). The angels serve the Lord in various capacities. For example, in Isaiah 6 they are described as making up the throne of God. Another example of angelic service is when God assigns an angel to a particular soul. We call these 'guardian angels,' and each person has one.

The angels are very happy to assist us. St. John Vianney says “Our Guardian Angels are our most faithful friends... We ought often to invoke them. The Angels take great pleasure in helping us with our enterprises when they are in accordance with God's will.” Padre Pio is an excellent example of the practice of using the guardian angels. There are numerous stories of his cooperating with the angels to do his ministry. For example, someone once asked their guardian angel to go to Padre Pio for intercession not realizing the time of night it was in Italy. Padre Pio later saw the person and remarked about the man's guardian angel waking him up late at night with his request. There are numerous other stories. St. Padre Pio's cooperation may be extraordinary, but it is open to all of us.

There are some things to keep in mind when we pray to the angels. First of all, prayer concerning angels goes back to biblical times. The angels assist men throughout scriptures. It is a good thing. The devils, like satan, also consider themselves angels. Accordingly, the church offers some guidelines for our prayer with the angels. We can always pray to our guardian angel. They are given to us alone. We can speak aloud to them or speak to them within the silence of our hearts. The Congregation for Divine worship says that the practice of naming angels (excepting those named in scripture) should be discouraged. There are exceptions to this rule as some countries have a devotion to certain angels. The instruction is to prudence. I believe the church discourages us from naming angels because there are also fallen angels who impersonate holy angels. The church's instruction is a caution in dealing with angelic beings who are in many ways above us. The church's teaching provides us with a safe ways of dealing with the angels. There are a number of devotions approved by the church which demonstrate prayer to the angels. The most commonly known is called the Angelus prayed at 6, 12 and 6. Other examples included the Sanctus (Holy Holy Holy...) at mass, the chaplet of St. Michael, the prayer to St. Michael and the guardian angel prayer.

I hope that this article has helped you know the angels a little better. For further reading about the angels, I suggest the Opus Sanctorum Angelorum and organization within the church. 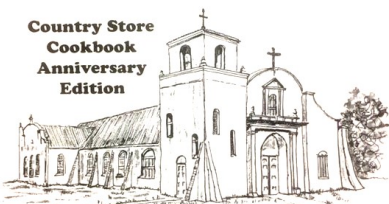
