Changed in the Light of God

What does it mean to live by the Spirit of God? It is perpetually a question for Christians, but it is more so for us who live today in such confusing times. Who do we believe? Who do we listen to? Who do we turn to for comfort or understanding when there seems to be disinformation and disunity on all sides? These are not questions of a select few, but for all. Even priests & religious have these questions because they are human. Thanks be to God, we have witnesses of God's love living in men and women, the saints, who also lived in difficult times.

This week we remember our Patron Saints Peter and his confrere St. Paul. On Monday, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Peter and Paul. St. Peter and St. Paul followed their own way until Jesus came into their lives. They each had to learn to account things differently than they had previously done. In a word, they had to learn to live by the Spirit of God.

God is trying to make a difference in all of our lives. He wants to heal our land. He wants to reconcile people. If we are experiences that we cannot recognize each other as Americans with a common heritage, it is not because God wanted this. He only wants our good, but God recognizes that sometimes we don't want this. He sends us prophets. He sends us saints. He sends us His own mother. How do we recognize peace like St. Peter and St. Paul? We recognize how much God truly means to us.

St. Paul writes in his epistles that everything he once considered important, he now considers rubbish. In other words, in light of what he receives from God, everything else is nothing. Peter, too had a conversion. When he was young, he was determined to be in charge, be a leader, and make things happen. As an old man, He also discovered that the best course of action is to surrender all to Jesus. Through surrender to God, these two saints gained the martyr's crown and countless souls for Christ.

In our world today, there is much suffering and inequality. Some people say that we achieve equality by cutting everyone down to the same height. This is not the way of the gospel. The way of God is to embrace our suffering Himself. Jesus suffers to show us that we are not forgotten or abandoned, even though we suffer. This is a lesson even the Apostles had to learn. Peter ran from the suffering Jesus, and Paul was persecuting the Church. Each of them came to recognize the face of God revealed in suffering. Peter was changed forever by the words of Jesus forgiving Peter's betrayal and inviting him to feed Jesus' people. Paul was converted on the way when he encountered Jesus suffering Paul's persecution. He was changed and never the same.

My brothers and sisters. Do you want change? Do you want peace? There is only one way. There has always been only one way. God's love. How long do we need to try other ways? How many times do we have to find out what the world offers doesn't measure up? If we are coming to a time of suffering and persecution, it is because we have passed up countless opportunities from God. It is never too late, but we need to act now. Remember, it was only when Paul fell down before God's glory and glimpsed things as God did that he converted.

As we celebrate Saints, Peter and Paul let us learn from their wisdom and example. Let us also turn to them for their intercession. Never before have there been such need of their intercession, and never before has heaven been so equipped us to help us. Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us.
