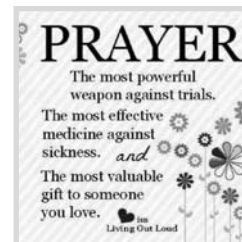

As we prepare to celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven, it is good for us to consider Mary not only as Queen but as mother. St. Louis de Montfort said that if you put all the love of all the mothers that ever were and ever will be, their love does not equal the love Mary has for us. Many of us turn to our mothers throughout our lives in difficult times. In these times that we are living, let us turn to Mary and seek her help.

The Dogmas of the faith regarding are not “inventions,” they are “solemn definitions,” which are defining what was already believed, already experienced. How do we know her as mother? Since Jesus’ gift of her at the Cross, she has been with us. Mary was present with the Apostles at Pentecost. She was known by the writers of the Gospels, especially Luke. Countless people throughout the ages have experienced her care. So do we every day.

One of my friends shared with me a time in her life when she experienced Mary as Mother. Her son was going on a three-hour road trip to see his girlfriend. That night, my friend had a vivid dream of her son in a terrible car accident; at the scene, she held her son’s lifeless body. She awoke and cried out to Mary and said, “If you are telling me that my son is going to die and meet your son, so be it.” “He is your son too.” “Please consider only one thing; if he is ready to meet your son. If he is not, please do something.” With this prayer of a mother’s heart, my friend not only prayed, but she also cried. She cried out to Mary, who understands as a mother the loss of a son.

As it turned out, my friend’s son was in a car accident. The accident was so bad that the police sent a unit that recovers bodies. However, he was found almost without a scratch, a miracle which he would later appreciate and attribute to Our Lady. This was an opportunity for my friend to know Mary as a mother. It is also an opportunity for us to see Mary as our mother and Mary caring for a soul who is far from God. Mary does not love troubled souls less. She loves them more because she has labored for their salvation.

When Pope Pius XII declared the Dogma of the Assumption, he did so to confirm the pious turning of Christians to Mary in light of the despair that followed the Second World War.

Just like the present age, our pontificate is weighed down by ever so many cares, anxieties, and troubles, by reason of very severe calamities that have taken place...Nevertheless, we are greatly consoled to see that, while the Catholic faith is being professed publicly and vigorously, piety toward the Virgin Mother of God is flourishing and daily growing more fervent. (Munificentissimus Deus, 2)

The pope witnessed the fruitfulness of Mary’s help in light of the darkest despair following the second World War and sought to confirm this through the solemn definition of Mary’s Assumption into Heaven. It is time for us also to do something similar.

In these days of suffering and trial, we need to turn to Mary. We need her help as we needed it in the aftermath of WWII. To this end, and to mark the beginning of the Year of St. Joseph in the Diocese, we will do two things. First, we are going to have seven days of prayer leading up the Feast of the Assumption (August 15th), and we are going to culminate the final day with a procession with the Eucharist. There will be more information next week. This is an opportunity for us to live out our faith in the Eucharist, put into practice our baptism, and live out the Consecration to Jesus and Mary we have made as a town.

The seven days of prayer beginning next Sunday will be an imitation of the march of the Israelites around Jericho. Jericho was an impenetrable fortress that the Israelites had no hope of conquering, but with God, they were able to. Throughout the seven days of the “Mater Fatima Siege of Jericho” we will pray, repent of our sin, the evils committed by ourselves and our country, and plead for Heaven’s help. If you believe like I do that we need heavenly aid for these times that we are living through then join us in prayer.

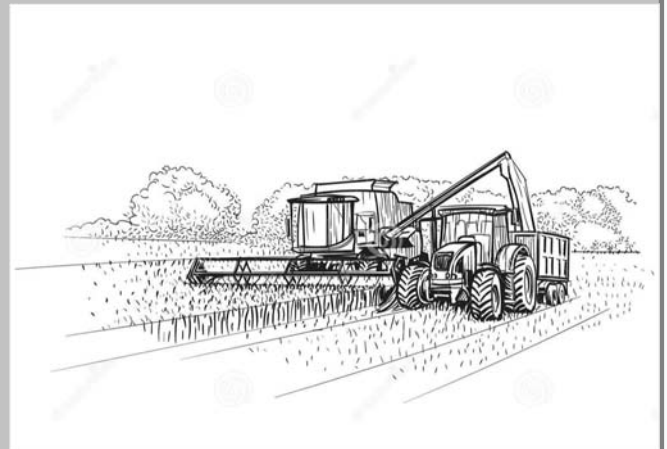
