**“Prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy.”- St. Thérèse of Lisieux**

Prayer is an essential part of Christian life, but what is it? Many times we either think too much or too little about prayer. Sometimes we ignore prayer until we need something. At other times, we overthink prayer and consider it something complicated or formulaic. The reality is that we need prayer, like our lungs need oxygen. It strengthens and sustains us. Prayer is much more than getting from God, something I want.

What prayer is not? Prayer is not a means of manipulating God. God is immovable. We cannot manipulate him into doing our will through fancy words or certain formulations. Jesus instructs us about this in the gospel. “Do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard for their many words”) Mt 6:7). The gods which the Gentiles believed in were like humans. They were able to be manipulated by appealing to their passions. God is not like this. He knows what we need before we ask him (cf. Mt 6:8). Our heavenly Father invites us to a relationship wherein he can give us the good things he has stored up for us from all eternity.

Prayer is living in a relationship with God. A relationship with God is like any other relationship in its essential components. To communicate well with a person, you need to know them. Sometimes we do not pray well because we have a very faint idea of who God is. Imagine someone trying to talk to us if they think every piece of land in Louisiana is a swamp and that we all act like the people portrayed in the show Swamp People. It would be challenging to communicate in a meaningful way because of the false assumptions. If these, however, are cleared away, then we can communicate on a deeper level. It is the same with prayer. If we know to whom we pray and understand that He really cares for us, it will be easier to pray.

It would seem that knowledge/experience of God is unobtainable except that God reveals himself to us. We experience God in His word (the scriptures), where he reveals himself to us. We also experience this through the testimony of the saints, through the priest or other holy persons. Perhaps a better way to explain this is sometimes when we really need God, and we pray, or another person makes him present to us, later we encounter the truth of this in the word of God. These kinds of experiences are an awakening to prayer.

Mother Teresa said once, “if you want to pray better, you should pray more.” If we spend time with Him in prayer, we will get to know Him. Start small. Pray for a few minutes each day through opening the gospels and considering what Jesus says and does. Prayer is always essential, but it is crucial in times of crisis. While the popular view of praying in crisis is something like wishful thinking, the reality is that God provides what man and human circumstances cannot. There are countless examples where God put supernatural, strength, or peace or trust in souls who needed it. No other created thing can do this. God does this even when there are no ordinary means to supply consolation.

God also inspires us through prayer with insights that otherwise, we would not have. This is another example of the way that God helps us. He is in this prayer relationship for our benefit. We need to put forth the effort to pray, even if we think we are doing it poorly. To quote the great G.K. Chesterton, “It seems to me that a thing worth doing is worth doing badly.” Prayer is the best example of this sentiment, and I have found it to be true.

The last piece of advice I have in learning to pray is to pray the rosary and ask Mary for help. I said that St. Therese helped me learn to pray, but it was Mary who taught me to really encounter Jesus. I can't explain it succinctly except to say that I prayed the rosary and asked for the grace of prayer. I prayed the rosary, and I asked Mary to help me obtain that which I did not know how to ask or obtain. Slowly, a little bit at a time, and at a pace that I could sustain, Mary taught me. Today I know Jesus and share time with Him, but I never fail to turn to Mary because she still aids me in growing ever deeper in union with Jesus. Mary Help of Christians, pray for us.
