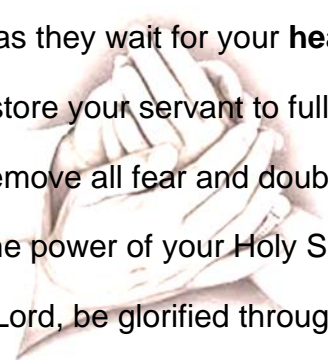

## *“Be Still and Know that I am God” - Psalm 46:10*

Listening to the voice of God is not easy in the best of circumstances. It always requires us to give a little of ourselves, not to earn entry to God’s presence, but to respond to God’s promptings. This is something that Samuel had to learn as a boy serving in the temple. God called him until Samuel understood whose voice it was calling. This is a crucial skill for all Christians. It is the foundation of faith

The barrier to understanding the world is relatively high. You need requisite levels of understanding, education, and means. Without this, your access to information can be quite limited. The access of every individual to God through faith is not limited. God speaks to the poor and rich, the educated and uneducated, Priest, and laity. As God is the father of all, God speaks to all. Surprisingly, we are the barrier to communication with God.

One of my friends once remarked that she wished God would just come down out of heaven and declare himself. The trouble is that we don’t really know what we are asking. We are usually unprepared for the thing we want God to say. It would be too much for us to bear. In time we come to realize this, but at the moment, it does not seem so. We learn to have faith that God will speak and listen when he does.

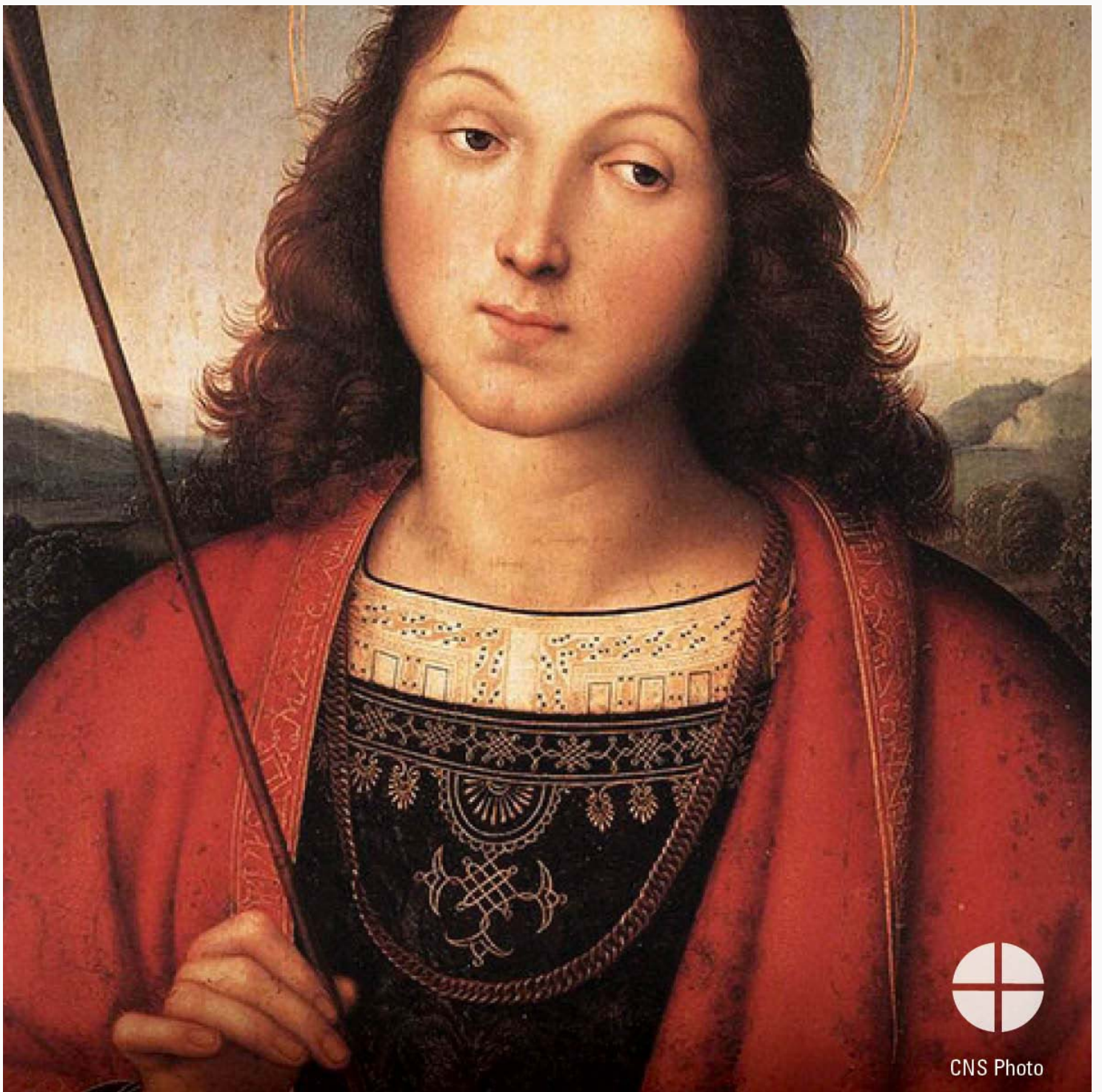
How do we learn to hear God’s voice? There is no definitive answer. I have found that we often hear God’s voice the clearest in the midst of great trials. Such trials force us to focus and quiet ourselves to the things of the world, which will not help. In the midst of trial, we know, or we learn, that we need God, and therefore we listen. Current events may lead some to unplug somewhat from the internet. I believe this is also an opportunity to hear God’s voice if we invite God into the spaces we vacate from other things.

Once in my life, I encountered something like what Samuel describes during his time in the temple. I was listening for God’s voice. I spent time in the chapel every day in addition to our seminary community prayers. However, I felt that I had not received a response. Then, in the middle of turmoil in my life, I had an experience while serving as an altar server for exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. In the midst of countless people for an outdoor benediction during a youth festival, I heard God’s answer to my prayer. God let me know he was with me and teaching me as he did with Samuel.

If you desire to hear God’s voice, then it is important to persevere in prayer. In my life, God has most often spoken to me in the midst of trial. I believe this is because that is when I was most open. However, God does speak at other times as well. There are also times where God tried to spare me personal suffering, but I ignored his voice and suffered the consequences. God was there to help me pick up the pieces. I have learned to trust that God hears me when I cry out to Him. He will respond. He does not always respond in the time frame or in the way that I want, but he comes. He comes when it matters, and I trust that when he delays, that also is for my good.

God desires to have a personal relationship with every one of us. Prayer requires two willing communicants, however, just as in other ordinary relationships. Relationships also take time. They take communication and even struggle in order to mature. So it is also with our relationship with God. Continue to pour yourself out to the Lord. It is helpful to keep a journal in order to have a record of our journey with God. Through it, you can learn in retrospect how God works in the midst of your turmoil. Invest yourself in God. He has already invested himself in you. In time you will discover and will lead others to discover the same.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK** Saint Sebastian **DIED C. 288 FEAST DAY: JANUARY 20** According to the many legends surrounding Sebastian, he was born in Gaul and raised in Milan. Though a Christian, he joined the imperial army at Rome about 283. He made converts of officials and jailers, effected cures and urged Christian prisoners to stay strong in their faith. He was named captain of the praetorian guards, but the emperor, upon finding out that he was a Christian, ordered his execution. Shot with arrows and left for dead, Sebastian survived and was nursed back to life. Later, he denounced the emperor for his cruelty to Christians, and the emperor had him beaten to death. A favorite subject of Renaissance artists, Sebastian is the patron saint of archers, soldiers and athletes.
